

2010 U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships in Bloomington, MN!

More than 400 athletes and 50 officials were at the Bloomington Ice Center April 14-17 for the 2010 U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships. The event was sanctioned by U.S. Figure Skating and hosted by the Figure Skating Club of Bloomington.

Championship events began on Friday with the championship compulsory dance and championship masters men's events and concluded Saturday with the championship free dance, championship pairs and championship masters ladies.

The Twin City Figure Skating

Association invites you to participate in the 2011 Minnesota State Figure Skating Championships August 20-22, 2010.

The competition is sponsored by the Twin City Figure Skating Association, hosted by the Eagan Ice Crystal FSC and conducted in the same manner as the 2011 U.S. Figure Skating Upper Great Lakes Regional Competition including the use of the IJS for Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior events.

This competition is sanctioned by U.S. Figure Skating. Kristin Arneson Cutler will be the Chief Referee and Lexie Kastner will be the Chief Accountant for the event.

Entries must be postmarked by July 2, 2010. The rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating as set forth in the 2011 Official Rulebook, with changes and clarifications as posted on the USFS web site, will govern this competition with the following exceptions:

- Pre Preliminary events are included.
- Both Short and Freeskate programs used to qualify for final rounds
- Please refer to the USFS web site for technical notification up dates.

The competition is open to all registered U.S. Figure Skating members in good standing who are residents of the state of Minnesota, OR home club members of a Minnesota U.S. Figure Skating club 1 year prior to closing date of entries (July 2, 2010). Skaters may compete at either their current freestyle test level, or one level higher. Elimination rounds will be conducted if necessary.

The competition will be held at Eagan Civic Center. 3870 Pilot Knob Road, Eagan, MN 55122.

Minnesota State Champions not only secure their place in Minnesota skating history but also are invited to the annual Officials Appreciation Banquet on Sunday September 12, 2010 and are featured along with Minnesota Sectional, National and International competitors in the Celebration of Champions Exhibition in early 2011.

The Twin City Figure Skating Association (TCFSA) was formed as a result of the combined efforts of the FSC of Minneapolis, the St. Paul FSC, and the Braemar-City of Lakes FSC who joined together to host the 1973 United States Figure Skating Championships. It now consists of figure skating clubs within the state of Minnesota who are permanent members of the United States Figure Skating Association (USFSA) and who desire to join the association

The purpose of this association is to foster, promote, improve, and encourage the sport of figure skating among youth under 18 years of age in the State of Minnesota, to promote cooperation between the 20 member clubs and to encourage and facilitate participation in regional, sectional, national, and international figure skating competitions.

This includes providing, hosting or sponsoring:

- a cohesive organization to bid on projects beyond a single clubs scope.
- an annual skating championship.
- an annual skating exhibition (Celebration of Champions) to highlight Sectional, National, International skaters, Minnesota State Champions and other special awards skaters
- an annual official's recognition dinner that also highlights Minnesota State Champions.
- Synchronized training camps and singles training camps with world-class coaches.
- monetary stipends to skaters advancing to Sectional, National and International competitions.
- training for our Minnesota Officials through judge's schools and seminars.
- a website that individual clubs may link to.

- to the Minnesota support Skating Scholarship fund and Academic Skating Scholarship
- a setting for clubs to exchange ideas and concerns
- two consolidated test sessions a year for singles and pairs, moves and free style tests.
- consolidated dance test sessions as needed.
- a quality newsletter to keep members informed.
- test coordinator to keep track of all test sessions held by member clubs.
- a \$ 500.00 ad stipend to clubs hosting a competition or ice show.
- an annual Champion for Skating award to a chosen volunteer.
- a seminar for USFA governing council delegates to understand the issues

History of Activities:

2004 - provided a USFS club management seminar with a \$ 75.00 rebate for two attendees from each club.

2005 - hosted a coaches and skaters seminar regarding the new ISU judging System.

2007 - hosted a judge's school.

2008 - hosted the US National Championships.

2009 - hosted a IJS Technical School

2010 - hosting U.S. Synchronized Skating Championships

2010 - hosting Judges School on new moves in the field.
